- 11. Adoption Of The Budget

Reference: Memo, N. Ard, D. Moran and J. Williams, 4/30/2017

The City Council has nearly completed its budget process which began when the proposed fiscal year 2018 budget was presented to Council on March 27. Since then, Council has held eight public work sessions to consider the budget. On April 24, the City Council held a public hearing in accordance with City Charter requirements. A list of changes was prepared based on Council discussion at the final budget review work session on May 17. Council held a second public hearing on May 22 to receive public input on these changes. The budget is now ready for adoption. The City Charter requires that the budget be adopted by June 10 for the fiscal year starting July 1.

Included in Council's packet is a memo listing the changes that have been suggested to the budget as it was proposed on March 27. In past years, Council has read each of the changes and made motions to approve them at the departmental level but this practice is not required. A motion to adopt the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget is sufficient. Once this motion is approved, Council can proceed to the next item of business, the ordinance to appropriate the funds included in the budget. If Council chooses to continue with the practice of approving changes at the departmental level, the changes are detailed in the referenced memorandum. (CM)

Section 51 of the City Charter states that "immediately upon adoption of the budget, the City Council shall adopt an ordinance appropriating funds for the ensuing year....to include a summary of estimated income.... and levy all property taxes and other taxes required to realize the income estimated."

Having amended the City Manager's proposed budget, Council now must introduce an ordinance to adopt the budget, appropriate funds, and establish tax rates for real and personal property for FY 2018. All funds have been incorporated into one ordinance.

It is recommended that Council introduce the ordinance, suspend the rules, and adopt the ordinance at this meeting. (CM)

Note: Per Council's Standing Rules, six (6) votes in the affirmative are needed in order to suspend the rules. If the budget ordinance is not adopted tonight, a special meeting will have to be scheduled on or before June 10.

#### 14. Program Open Space (POS) FY 2018 Annual Program

Reference: Correspondence, Department of Natural Resources 5/11/17 FY 2018 Proposed Annual POS Program, T. Hruby

The City's FY 2018 Annual Program Open Space (POS) Program is due to the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) on June 16, 2017. The City has been notified that the County will be receiving a total of \$5,590,935 in FY 2018 POS funds. Based on the results of the 2010 Census the City will be receiving \$149,277.96. Since the County is meeting the State's requirement that 50 percent of local POS funds be used for acquisition projects, the City is able to use 100 percent of its POS allocation towards development.

The City has POS funds encumbered for the following development projects: Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center Phase II Improvements, Community Center Facility Upgrades, Buddy Attick Park Master Plan Improvements, and Springhill Lake Recreation Center Expansion. Not including the City's FY 2018 POS allocation, the City has \$62,948.58 in unencumbered acquisition funds and \$175,076.18 in unencumbered development funds. The City's unencumbered development funds have been allocated to the Community Center Facility Upgrades project and the Community Center Playground Renovations project.

Consistent with the City's adopted FY 2018 budget, staff is proposing the City's FY 2018 POS funds be allocated to the following projects: \$133,500 for the Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center Phase IV Improvements, \$10,000 for Buddy Attick Park Master Plan Improvements, \$3,080.50 for Community Center Playground Improvements and \$2,697.46 for land acquisition. Staff also proposes to revert the remaining POS funds balance from

Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center Phase III Improvements project (\$27,689) to land acquisition. Since the State has inquired about lack of progress on the Springhill Lake Recreation Center Expansion Project, staff is proposing to revert the remaining encumbered fund balance on this project (\$44,459) to land acquisition. This will bring the City's unencumbered land acquisition fund balance to \$137,794.

It is recommended Council approve the City's FY 2018 Program Open Space Annual Program as proposed. (TH)

# 15. Proposed County Legislation CB-049-2017 - An Ordinance Concerning Nonconforming Uses

Reference:

CB-049-2017, DR 1

The City has received notification that the County's Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED) is tentatively scheduled to discuss CB-049-2017 on June 7, 2017. CB-49-2017 proposes to amend approval requirements for the certification of nonconforming uses.

CB-49-2017 proposes additional approval criteria in the Zoning Ordinance for certification of nonconforming uses, including compliance with certain County Landscape Manual requirements for screening and enclosure of trash facilities, compliance with off-street parking and loading requirements and certain building code requirements. The Bill also provides for certain retroactive applicability to existing nonconforming uses.

Staff is concerned with the implications CB-49-2017 will have on existing certified nonconforming uses in the City, particularly the original apartment buildings in historic Greenbelt. These uses would not be able to meet current parking and loading standards, and therefore would not be eligible to receive a new Use and Occupancy Permit in the future. Such a requirement appears to defeat the purpose of nonconforming certification and staff does not believe it is appropriate to require such uses to go through the Departure process.

Staff believes there are unintended consequences to CB-49 -2017 that the sponsor, County Council Member Deni Taveras, has not taken into consideration. It is recommended City Council submit a letter to the County Council conveying the City's concerns with the implications CB-49-2017 will have on nonconforming uses in Greenbelt. (TH)
