CITY WELCOMES NICOLE ARD

At the City Council meeting of Monday, January 23, Nicole Ard was sworn in as Greenbelt's City Manager. Ms. Ard was appointed to the position after a nationwide search, community input and City Council interviews.

Ms. Ard has over 20 years of experience in local government management and is an International City/County Management Association (ICMA) Credentialed

Manager. She has worked in Phoenix, AZ; Leesburg, VA.; Hillsborough, NC; Dayton, OH; Dublin, OH and as City Manager in Sandusky, OH. She has her undergraduate degree in Political Science from Howard University and her graduate degree in Public Administration from Ohio State University.

"I am excited to work with the City Council, community and staff. It is an honor to serve Greenbelt – such a historic, friendly and welcoming community. I look forward to working with retiring City Manager Mike McLaughlin and Greenbelt's incredible staff."

Greenbelt's long standing City Manager, Michael McLaughlin recently retired, but stayed on for a few weeks to ensure a smooth transition. Mr. McLaughlin was well loved by the city staff who all wish Mr. McLaughlin a long, happy and adventurous retirement.

Of Ms. Ard, Mayor Emmett Jordan stated, "She is a seasoned manager with over 2 decades of municipal government experience with several jurisdictions. We felt that her skills and experience are the 'right fit' for Greenbelt going forward."

The City of Greenbelt welcomes Ms. Ard and is eager to work with her in continuing the Greenbelt tradition of providing services to its residents and the community.



FY 2018 BUDGET PREVIEW

The City's annual budget process is underway. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 revenues and expenditures are on target with the FY 2017 Adopted Budget, and the City is expecting the FY 2018 budget to be positive as well. On the revenue side, the values of detached homes, town homes and condos were higher, but apartments and commercial values were lower. The value of all residential properties are expected to be higher in FY 2018.

Hotel/motel taxes have increased by 4.6%, but no change is expected in Highway User Revenue. Over all it is expected that FY 2017 revenues will reach the budgeted amount of \$27.2 million.

On the expenditure side, there has been low inflation and fuel costs have remained low as well. The retirement of some personnel has resulted in lower salary and benefit costs. Some of these savings have been offset by higher health care costs and increased Workers Compensation costs.

Taking all that into account, the City Departments have been asked to prepare their budgets to cover existing services, but to look and identify any savings, efficiencies, different ways to "do business," etc. that could be considered without impacting services.

The City Manager will present her Proposed FY 2018 Budget to City Council on Monday, March 27. The public will have the opportunity to comment throughout the months of April and May at the various work sessions. Two public hearings on the budget will also be held. Meeting dates will be advertised in the *Greenbelt News Review* and at www.greenbeltmd.gov. The Proposed Budget document will be available for download at www.greenbeltmd.gov after it is presented to City Council.

2017 IS A CITY COUNCIL ELECTION YEAR

The next Greenbelt City Election of City Council will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017. Every 2 years, the City elects its 7 member City Council at large. There are no election precincts and all candidates run for Council with the highest vote getter traditionally being appointed as Mayor. All candidates for City Council must be at least 18 years old and reside within the corporate boundaries of the City of Greenbelt.
