Indecent Exposure. The victim advised that on June 12th at 2:30 P.M. she was at Buddy Attick Park with two young children when she observed the suspect sitting on a park bench looking at the children playing near the lake. When the victim walked by the subject got up and began to jog away, then sat down at another nearby bench. As she left the park with her children a short time later she noticed that the suspect was exposing himself. The victim then reached for her cell phone, at which time the suspect fled the area on foot. The suspect did not approach the children or the victim. The suspect is described as a black male, 40 to 50 years of age, 6' tall, wearing a long sleeve workout type shirt, grey athletic shorts and a grey Washington Nationals baseball cap.
