RESOLUTION NUMBER 2008

A RESOLUTION TO NEGOTIATE THE PURCHASE OF THE REMOVAL OF AN UNDERGROUND FUEL TANK AT THE POLICE STATION AND REPLACEMENT OF AN ABOVE GROUND FUEL TANK AT THE PUBLIC WORKS FACILITY FROM CAPITOL PETROLEUM EQUIPMENT INC. AT A COST OF \$132,974

WHEREAS, a 10,000 gallon underground fuel tank was installed at the Police Station in 1989 and a 6,000 gallon above ground fuel tank was installed at Public Works in 1992; and

WHEREAS, the police station tank has had difficulty complying with Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) standards for underground storage tanks and passing annual inspections and has been cited in the past for non-compliance with the State Oil Control Program; and

WHEREAS, the City has decided to replace both tanks with one new 10,000 gallon above ground tank at Public Works which will serve the entire City vehicle fleet; and

WHEREAS, staff obtained proposals from three vendors and the proposal from Capitol Petroleum Equipment was the lowest quote. NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Greenbelt, Maryland, that the City Manager be authorized to negotiate the purchase of removal of an underground gas tank at the police station and replacement of an above ground gas tank at public works from Capitol Petroleum Equipment Inc. at a cost of \$132,974.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.
