RE: Community Questionnaire

As has been done for years, a questionnaire was made available at the polling places on Election Day 2017 and at early voting precincts. It was also published in the News Review the week before, and the week after, the Election and was made available online. The questionnaires were tabulated by the University of Maryland Institute for Governmental Service and Research.

This memo summarizes the key points in the results. Attached is a copy of the questionnaire with the results included. Additional detail on the responses is available in the City Manager's Office.

1. 1,360 questionnaires were completed. This is 53% of the people who voted. The response rate is up 6% from 2015. This is the largest number of questionnaires completed since at least 1991. Past response rates were 47% (954) in 2015, 46% (893) in 2013, 55% (968) in 2011, 32% (770) in 2009 and 39% (749) in 2007.

Precinct 3 submitted 26% of responses, precinct 6 - 13%, precinct 8 - 8%, precinct 13-10% and precinct 18 submitted 6% of the responses. Another 16% were submitted during early voting, 3% were mailed-in or hand-delivered and 18% were completed online. (*It is not known which precinct the early voting, mail-in and online surveys came from.*)

2. 59% of respondents were either from single family detached homes (24%) or GHI (35%). The remainder were distributed as follows: 13% in apartments, 16% in townhouses and 13% in condominiums.
3. 32% of respondents were between the ages of 45 to 60 and 40% were over 60.

4. 40% of respondents have lived in Greenbelt more than 20 years (46% in 2015, 44% in 2013, 45% in 2011, 44% in 2009, 42% in 2007, 45% in 2005, 39% in 2003 and 36% in 2001) and another 22% have lived here 11 to 20 years.
5. 27% of respondents are retired. It was 33% in 2015, 35% in 2013, 33% in 2011, 29% in 2009, 31% in 2007, 28% in 2005, 29% in 2003 and 10% in 2001.
6. Of those working, 20% (197) work in Greenbelt. 25% (248) work elsewhere in Prince George's County and 23% (226) work in Washington, DC. These three total 68%. (There were 381 "no responses" to this question, so the percentages above reflect those who actually answered. In another question 369 respondents identified themselves as retired which could explain most of the no responses.)

In comparing 2017 total scores to 2015 scores on the same questions for the City's largest service areas (public safety, public works & recreation), 31 scores decreased while 13 increased. This is the second consecutive questionnaire that a majority of scores declined. Most Public Safety and Public Works scores decreased 2% or less. (A 2% decrease is about a one-tenth of a point.) Scores had generally increased from 2007 to 2013, and staff believed at some point, they would level off.

One of the key purposes of the questionnaire is for citizens to rate City services. All City services scored well with many services being very highly rated. 34 of the 44 service questions in Public Safety, Public Works and Recreation scored 4.00 or higher. In order to achieve a score of 4.00, three-fourths of respondents would have to rate a service "good" or "excellent".

In order of scoring, the top 5 rated services were Special Events (4.54), Performing Art Programs (4.54), Other Activities (4.53), Fitness Classes (4.47) and Parks (4.42).

The 5 lowest rated services were Parking Enforcement (3.64), Springhill Lake Recreation Center (3.67), Dog Park (3.69), Traffic Control (3.77) and Bike Lanes (3.82).

The score for Fitness Classes had the greatest percentage increase (6.57%). The score for Traffic Control had the greatest decrease (-3.72%).

Attached to this memo are three spreadsheets which provide more detail on the survey results. Table 1 is a spreadsheet which illustrates scores for the past 6 surveys and shows the percentage change between 2015 and 2017. Table 2 shows results of certain questions broken down by precinct, and compared to the 2015 results. Table 3 lists the 2017 raw scores for each question broken down by precinct.

There were other useful findings:

1. Three “current” questions were asked. 67% did not think Council’s term of office should change to 4 years. 59% did not believe non-US citizens should be allowed to vote in City elections. 62% did not favor widening the BW Parkway to six lanes and 70% did not support widening the Beltway to allow express toll lanes.
2. Eighty-six (86) percent of respondents who had contact with the Police department since 2015 indicated the Police employee was polite and courteous. Eighty-three (83) percent indicated they were assisted satisfactorily.
3. In Community Development, 79% of respondents noted the employee was polite and courteous. Also, 72% indicated they were assisted satisfactorily.
4. There were 766 respondents who had contact with Public Works. Eighty-six (86%) indicated the employee was polite and courteous.
5. In response to a question about how residents prefer to receive information about City programs and services, the top preference was Greenbelt News Review followed by Email and City Newsletter.
6. A number of education related questions were asked. Because of the limited number of responses to these questions, the information may be of limited use. Once the respondents were broken down by school, the numbers of responses for each of the schools listed were few, ranging from a high of 106 for Greenbelt Elementary to a low of 20 for Turning Point Academy. Eleanor Roosevelt High School was the highest rated at 3.96, while Turning Point Academy received the lowest score at 3.05. The Prince George’s School system overall received a 2.80.
7. When asked if they make use of www.greenbeltdmd.gov, 768 (66%) of those responding to this question marked yes.
8. Under City Services and Taxes, residents were asked to rate the value of City services and programs for their tax dollars. The overall average score was 4.04 out of 5.00. The score was 4.01 in 2015, 4.10 in 2013, 4.21 in 2011, 4.06 in 2009 and 4.04 score in 2007. A majority of respondents indicated they would support a tax increase to maintain current services and programs (844 or 62%) and/or to provide fair compensation to employees (899 or 66%). However, only 45% (614) indicated they would support a tax hike to increase City services/programs. 749 respondents wanted City services kept at the same level. A new question was asked regarding a tax increase to participate in green initiatives and 66% indicated they would support this.

The questionnaire tabulation also includes the “General Comments” questions at the end of the survey as well as other verbatim responses. Our vendor reviewed these verbatim responses and identified similarities among the answers. These responses are available in a separate document (152 pages).

Congratulations to the citizens, Council and employees of the City of Greenbelt. This questionnaire again shows the quality of the service being provided to the community and the support for the organization in the community, though there are areas to improve.
