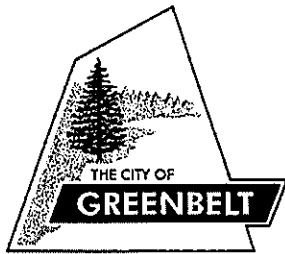

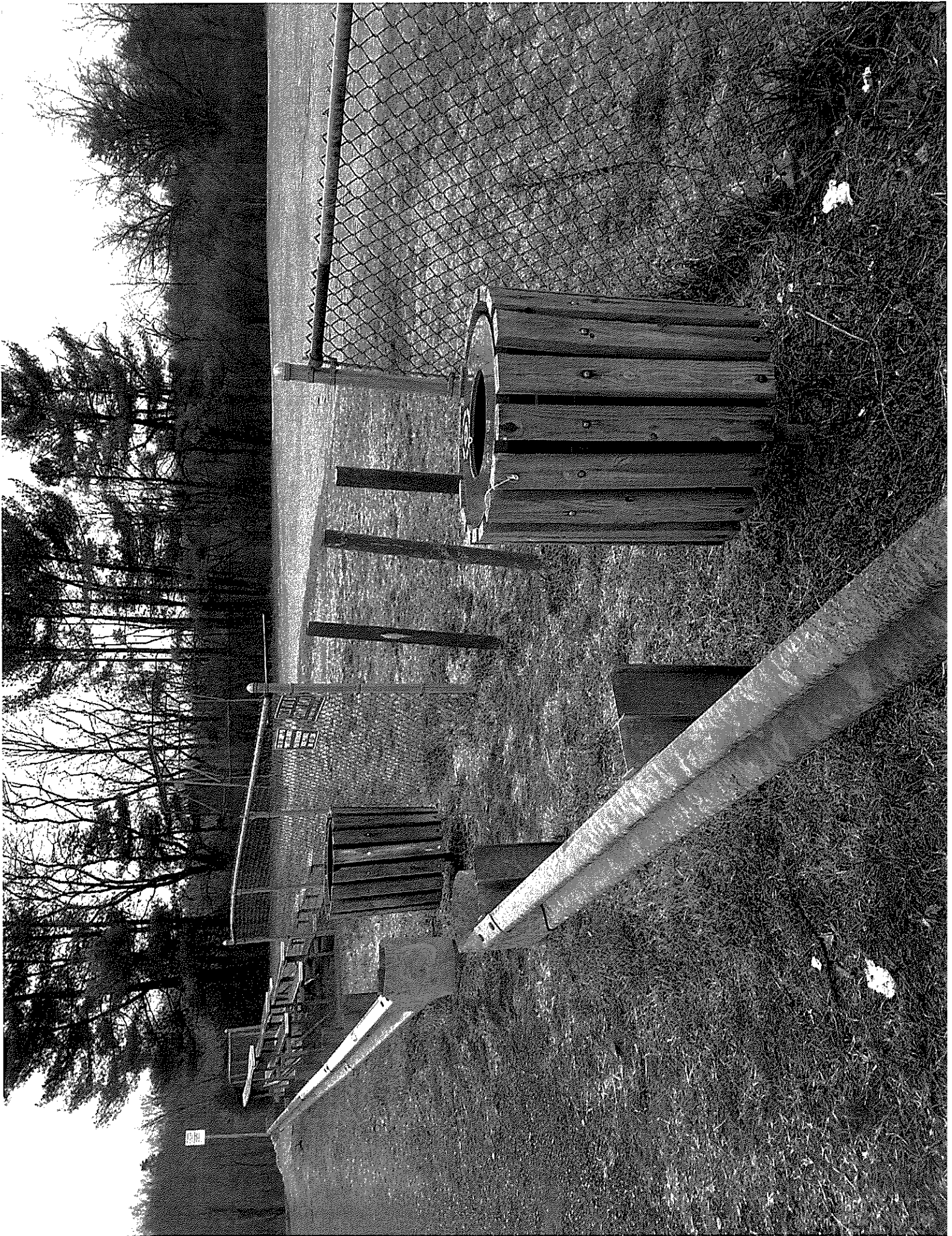
Mike,
