

City Manager's Report Week Ending March 31, 2017

1. Staff is preparing numerous reports for submission at Monday's budget work session.
2. As noted via email, will be working on transition of the City Clerk and the Director of Planning & Community Development pending confirmation of those retirement dates.
3. Scheduled the visit to NASA to view the James Webb Telescope. The tour is on April 6th at 3pm. This will include a greeting from Director Chris Scolese.
4. Provided a letter of support for community volunteers' effort to apply for county development grant to implement composting projects at the New Deal Café loading dock and the Springhill Lake Recreation Center. Many thanks to Mr. David Moran, Mr. Jim Sterling, Ms. Celia Craze, Ms. Erin Josephitis and Mr. Joe McNeal who helped sort out the petitioners' request, potential solutions, and in-kind support. City support will include building the compost bins, delivering wood chips; and for one year, teaching educational sessions on composting via vermiculture to residents who live in local apartments.
5. Coordinated with staff and other communities regarding the scope of the ULI TAP application. The ULI application deadline is April 3, 2017. ULI and COG select projects in May and work with communities to schedule them according to need.
6. Coordinated with staff regarding Dr. Park's concern about additional language added to the youth services bureau funding contract with Prince George's County. A letter is being finalized to send to the county to request the language be changed.
7. Continued working with staff and the City Solicitor to address an appeal property maintenance complaint on Hanover Parkway. The property owner is refusing to receive mail. The tenant has moved out and has expressed appreciation for city staff's work to address living conditions.
8. Following up on the Greenbelt Station resident's request for shuttle service to the College Park Metro during the upcoming WMATA repair work. Also will share the concern regarding an expanded schedule to address neighbor's concerns.
9. Following up on recent petition and request for information on the county school system's water improvements at Greenbelt Schools. A letter will be sent to the school system requesting information on the improvements made in Greenbelt facilities.

10. Continued contact with a local homeowners association and multiple departments, including Police, Planning, and CARES regarding a local resident's potential mental health and contacts with local officials and HOA representatives.
11. Confirmed that candy sales in the Greenbriar parking lots are not the jurisdiction of city staff, including police.
12. In follow up to the Council goal setting session, working with Mr. David Moran and Ms. Anne Marie Belton to investigate alternative forms of reporting, including potential software to streamline the multiple lists of requests and referrals provided to Council by staff (for example, CAR, petitioners, etc.). This also includes identifying the multiple reports and the purpose, use, and continued need for each document.
13. Met with Mrs. Donna Almquist regarding the Forest Preserve.
14. The consultant agreement for the Recreation Master Plan received an additional review, including review by the City Solicitor Karen Ruff. The document has been forwarded to GreenPlay via Mr. Joe McNeal.
15. Ms. Megan Young continues to work on nine replacement interpretive panels. Ms. Young is working with the contractor to size and finalize the image to be displayed as the original images were not available (the last panel was added about five years ago).
16. Requested information on the status of the county payment for the FY 2016 School Resource Officer funding.
17. Confirmed that the Greenbelt Marriott made arrangements directly with the Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center to use the city's indoor pool during repairs to the Marriott Pool. The Marriott has been purchasing city pool passes for guests since November 2016. The arrangement was slated to end in May 2017.
18. Followed up on meeting with the Friends of the Greenbelt Theatre.
19. Thank you to Mr. Jeff Williams, Ms. Anne Marie Belton, Ms. Beverly Palau, Ms. Shaniya Lashley-Mullens, Mr. David Moran, and Mr. Mike McLaughlin for their work on the proposed FY 2018 budget presented on March 27th.
20. Thank you for Mr. McLaughlin's work during the transition. His last day as a city employee is March 31st.
21. Attended the Council's Business Coffee with the Lt. Governor as speaker. Thank you to Ms. Anne Marie Belton, Mr. David Moran, Ms. Shaniya Lashley-Mullens, Ms. Terri Hruby, and Ms. Beverly Palau for their assistance before and after the event.
22. Presented Mr. James Keifline, mechanic, with a retirement gift on behalf of the city. Mr. Keifline retired from the city on March 31st after many years of service to Public Works and Police. Mr. Keifline started his service as a summer worker.

23. Provided brief comments to the Greenbriar Home Owners Association.
24. Attended Greenbelt Rotary Club meeting. A reimbursement request for dues will be submitted to the City (\$175.00).
25. Submitted an invoice from the International City/County Management Association for dues (\$1,376.00).
