

GREENBELT POLICE ANNOUNCES PARTNERSHIP WITH AUTISM FYI

The Greenbelt Police Department has partnered with Autism FYI in support of their National Autism Registry. Children and adults with a diagnosis on the Autism Spectrum may voluntarily register.

Autism Spectrum Disorder is a neurological and biological condition that affects a person for life. It can present with symptoms that cause major social, emotional and/or cognitive disabilities. It can present with symptoms so mild it is difficult to tell. It is often classified as Severe Autism, Mild Autism, or Asperger's Syndrome. They may have a combination of symptoms in varying degrees of severity, which is why each person's presentation is unique.

A goal of the registry is to increase the safety of the registrant and public safety employees who come into contact with them. The home address of registrants will be entered into the PSC CAD system as an alert. This means that when a call is dispatched to a location where the registrant lives, the responding officers will be made aware that a person with Autism lives at that address and be provided with identifying information. When this Records Management System goes into effect in the coming months, an alert will also be triggered if the registrant's name is run through the system.

Due to heat advisories this week, our camp managers adjusted plans to more indoor activities to accommodate the steamy weather. Our performing arts camps all had performances! Creative Kids Campers focused on their second production of "Summer Circus," with two shows on Friday at 10am & 2:15pm in the Greenbelt Arts Center. Circus Camp shared their talents at their performance on Friday at 1pm in the Community Gym. Congratulations to our senior performing arts campers for their wonderful performances!

- Attended the Youth Advisory Committee meeting and Labor Day Committee meeting.
- Met with Caitlin McGrath, Director of Old Greenbelt Theatre, to coordinate plans for both the Moonlit Movie Series and Halloween Costume Parade event.
- Recreation Centers have been busy with camps and summer drop-in programs.
- Free Summer Fun Runs at Buddy Attick Park continued. Runs are every Thursday evening through 8/26 at 7pm. Registration takes place in the Youth Center parking lot prior to each Thursday event.
- Springhill Lake Recreation Center hosted a free skate event on Friday evening from 5-7pm.
- Staff is working on planning Fall programs and publication of the 2016 Fall Activity Guide.

AQUATIC AND FITNESS CENTER:

COMMUNITY CENTER:

The cast included 100+ campers and camp staffers.

- Supervisor continued to field inquires in regard to food operations rentals for the Commercial Kitchen. There have been 143 inquiries since April 2015. There are currently six caterers who received all permits and may rent the Kitchen.
- There were 2 facility reservations processed.
- There were 2 private rentals and 13 pattern rentals.
- The following groups received free space: Golden Age Club, Greenbelt Concert Band, Greenbelt Writers Group,
 Greenbelt News Review, Miss Greenbelt Scholarship Organization, Greenbelt Nursery School, Greenbelt Labor Day

 Foundation, Greenbrook Estates and Greenbelt Computer Club.

THERAPUTIC RECREATION:

- Staff has been working on the Fall senior programs.
- Two new assessments and evaluations were done on some of our campers. Parents were contacted and new behavior contracts will be implemented starting next week. So far, all the campers and staff are thoroughly enjoying themselves.
- The Thursday shopping trip to Arundel Mills had to be postponed till next week due to the Connection being used for another city event. Participants and driver were all contacted.
- The TR staff met on Thursday morning to discuss the campers with special needs and get prepared for the third session of camp which starts on Monday. We do have some new children attending next session.
