Greenbelt Recreation Department Weekly Report

Week Ending July 29, 2016

ADMINISTRATION:

- Attended Council Work-session on Monday night to discuss the newly proposed Civic, Recognition and Contribution Group process. Suggestions were made by Council and those in attendance; staff met on Thursday to review these comments and will make changes as necessary.
- Since PRAB is unable to meet until late September, Council has requested comments from PRAB regarding the newly proposed Civic, Recognition and Contribution Group process. The packet of information was delivered to AAB and PRAB and an email was sent to PRAB requesting there comments. These comments will be compiled by staff and given to City Council before the end of August.
- Six in-house interviews were held this week for the GAFC Administrative Assistant position; Susie Noaman will be transferring from part-time classified at the Community Center to fulltime classified as the Aquatic and Fitness Center Administrative Assistant. As mentioned a couple of weeks ago, Julie Magness will be moving fulltime to the Human Resources Department.
- In response to the RFP Marketing and Communications Audit that the department sent out in June, staff contracted with LMD Agency out of Laurel, Maryland. LMD will begin their work in late August, early September. Following the completion of the audit, staff will be making recommendations for FY18, as needed.
- Staff is working to prepare for the National Night Out events throughout Greenbelt next week.
- Met with Aquatic and Fitness Center staff to review various items.
- A number of park permit applications were received this week and reviewed for processing and approval.
- Director will be on leave through August 8 and Assistant Director, Joe McNeal will serve as the acting Director in her absence.

YOUTH CENTER/ SPRINGHILL LAKE/PARK RANGERS/GREENBELT KIDS:

- Our campers definitely displayed their talent this week! Creative Kids Camp performed their third production of "Summer Circus" with two shows on Friday at 10am & 2:15pm in the Greenbelt Arts Center. Circus Camp spent the week improving their circus skills and shared their talents at their performance on Friday at 1pm in the Community Center Gym. Camp Pine Tree campers have been preparing for the Annual Talent Show all session long! CPT campers joined with Camp YOGO campers for a wonderful display of talent on Thursday afternoon in the Youth Center gym. Along with rehearsing, Camp Pine Tree 1 took a field trip to the Baltimore Museum of Industry and Camp Pine Tree 2 visited Cunningham Falls State Park. Camp YOGO spent time rehearsing for the talent show as well, but managed to enjoy a bowling outing and a trip to Cascade Lake early in the week. On Friday YOGO campers visited the Smithsonian museums and experienced an IMAX film. Kinder Camp walked to the Old Greenbelt Theatre on Monday to participate in a program co-sponsored by the library. Campers enjoyed story time, a short film, craft project and popcorn! On Wednesday our youngest campers traveled to the College Park Aviation Museum. They learned about the local history of flight and many made their first paper airplane! Our youngest campers enjoyed two visits to the pool this week and ended their session with a trip to the library and the Circus Show.
- 2016 Summer Camp registration continues this week. We have a few spots left in some of our camp programs.
- Recreation Centers have been busy with camps and summer drop-in programs.
- Free Summer Fun Runs at BAP continue this week. Runs are every Thursday evening through 8/26 at 7pm.
 Registration takes place in the YC parking lot prior to each Thursday event.
- Staff attended the Roosevelt Center Merchants Association Meeting on Thursday.
- Staff are working on planning Fall programs and publication of the 2016 Fall Activity Guide.

AQUATIC AND FITNESS CENTER:

- Registration for session 3 of children's weekday lessons started July 23 for Greenbelt residents and pass holders, open registration started July 25. Classes will run August 2-12.
- Participated in interviews for the Administrative Assistant position at GAFC.
- Sent out e-mail blast reminder about session 3 of weekday children's swim lessons.

Attended weekly meeting with Assistant Director.

Community Center:

- Creative Kids Camp presented two performances at the Arts Center of Summer Circus, the story of a group of cousins who are invited to spend the summer on the farm with their eccentric Aunt Beverly, only to discover that she is trying to rescue a failing circus. The cast included 100+ campers and camp staffers.
- Circus Camp presented the Session III Summer Circus Show. The show was a showcase of circus acts and skills, performed by 24 campers, under the direction of former Ringling Bros. performer Gregory May.
- Supervisor met with two potential food operations for Kitchen rentals.
- Supervisor continues to field inquires in regard to food operations rentals for the Commercial Kitchen. There have been 147 inquiries since April 2015. There are currently six caterers who received all permits and may rent the Kitchen.
- There were 3 facility reservations processed.
- There was 1 private rental and 8 pattern rentals.
- The following groups received free space: Golden Age Club, Greenbelt Concert Band, Greenbelt Writers Group, Greenbelt Astronomy, Green ACES, Greenbelt Labor Day Committee, CCRIC
- The following City groups received space: Forest Preserve Advisory Board, Advisory Planning Board

ARTS:

- Creative Kids Camp, Clay at the End of the Day, and the summer stagecraft teen internship program are underway. Staff and volunteers supported the session III CKC rehearsal and performances. Quarterly classes running this session include: Family Ceramics; Sew for Charity; Figurative Hand-Building; Paper Resist Techniques for ceramic surface decoration; Ceramics Open Studio; and Levels 1/2 and 3/4 potter's wheel.
- Staff are curating a selection of photos from the Camp Encore production of A Midsummer Night's Dream for future use in the next production design exhibition.
- Staff participated in the 7/25 work session on Contribution Group program updates and are preparing for a meeting next week of the Arts Advisory Board.
- Publicity is underway for the August 7 Community Art Drop-In which will feature a printmaking workshop with Artist in Residence Kathy Karlson.
- Ongoing tasks include: scouting artists for the Festival of Lights and for exhibition programming; processing Art and Craft Fair applications; hiring and training new special event technicians; and developing FY17 programs.

THERAPUTIC RECREATION:

- Thirty-five individuals travelled to the Bowie BaySox stadium on Wednesday for the BaySox Bingo sponsored by Hearing Professionals. Participants won at bingo eleven times! Despite the BaySox losing, the group enjoyed lunch, bingo and watching the game, all from the comfort of an air conditioned room. Some chose to sit outside to watch the game as well.
- The TR staff had their weekly meeting Thursday morning. Our new Inclusion staff, Jack Britton-Powell was introduced. The fourth session of camp has more children with special needs requiring extra support. Since the age of these children are spread out, they are assigned to different groups, requiring more staff.
- The next Contra dance is scheduled for Saturday, August 6. Lessons start at 6:30 and the dance is from 7-9:45 pm.

July 29

Judye Hering completed a successful after summer-school tutoring program on Thursday, July 28. Students entering kindergarten through 6 grade met every afternoon, Monday through Thursday, at the Springhill Lake Recreation Center Clubhouse, throughout the month of July. Students were assigned summer packets and worked on skills in preparation for returning to school. DarrenStephens was able to include these youth in the summer meals program and students received free lunches. Ms. Mendoza, Bi-lingual-Parent Liaison from Springhill Lake Elementary School, assisted with the program and provided information for non-English speakers. Parents inquired about having an ESOL program for the fall. 47 students enrolled in the program with an average of 22 students attending daily.
