- 1. As the end of 2015 approaches, I would like to wish everyone a happy holiday and best wishes in the coming year. Thanks for all that you have done to make Greenbelt a wonderful community!

Darren Stephenson and Glenda Willis spoke at the Mentoring to Manhood Program at the Kentland Community Center in Landover on December 5. There were 13 parents in attendance. Darren and Glenda presented CARES information, and provided parents an overview on Adolescent Depression; signs, symptoms, causes and triggers. Time was also spent discussing appropriate strategies that the parents could utilize, as well as informing them of the many counseling and treatment options that are readily available in the community.

Tuesday, December 8, Rosalind Ceasar, Staff Liaison, attended the regular monthly Advisory Committee on Education meeting. The meeting was primarily to review the annual grant proposals received from the area schools. Twenty-one (21) out of thirty-three (33) grants were recommended for approval by the City Council.

Judye Hering began publicizing CARES' winter session of the babysitting course. The course will be held on Tuesday, December 29, from 1:00-4:00, in the Municipal Building. The course is targeted for students in 5-8th grade, ages 10-13. Students will learn about health, safety and responsibility issues regarding babysitting.

A series of eight meetings of a Memory Support group for people with early dementia was completed. It was co-led by Helen Barnes, R.N., and Tom Patota, L.C.S.W.-C, with the assistance of Cindy Lynkew, graduate student intern from the University of New England School of Social Work.

Cindy Lynkew completed her graduate social work internship with the G.A.I.L. program, having contributed 560 supervised work hours for Greenbelt seniors and disabled.

Liz Park and Christal Batey met with Peggy Higgins from College Park to discuss the GAIL program. Christal reviewed her many programs and the evolution of the GAIL program. GIVES was also discussed as an example of an all-volunteer program available to seniors for support. Peggy and her staff were invited to join the Aging on Place Prince George's group that meets monthly to discuss aging services.
