- Staff met with contractor to review indoor pool roof replacement project.
- Coordinated delivery and pick up of tables and chairs for National Night Out events at Roosevelt Center, Beltway Plaza Mall and Schrom Hills Park.
- The M-NCPPC playground programs at Schrom Hills Park and Greenbelt Elementary School finished up last week.
- Staff has been working with CARES on scheduling Vision Van locations and the annual Flu Clinic.
- Met with various departments to review draft of outdoor event and public meeting policy guide and permit application.
- Two new Park Rangers were hired.
- Held staff meeting for part-time Center Leaders assigned to work at the Youth Center.
- Attended "Meet and Greet" event at the Greenbelt Middle School for new Acting Principal, Mr. George Covington.

YOUTH CENTER/SPRINGHILL LAKE

- Scheduled staff for Labor Day weekend and Costume Parade.
- Collected data for the Playground Project.
- Assisted in the box office for the circus show.
- Trophies were purchased for the Labor Day weekend tournaments.
- Reached out to local vendors for the Fall Family Fit Night Challenge.
- Fourth Session of summer camp came to an end. The performing arts camps performed their shows, including Greenbelt Youth Circus who had four performances.
- Prepared for Session 5, the final camp session.
- Camps travelled to Hershey Park, Sky Zone and Greenbrier State Park.

AQUATIC AND FITNESS CENTER

- The last day of children's swim lessons were August 8 (weekday) and August 9 (Saturday). The fall session is scheduled to begin September 27.
- The Bee Yoga Fusion Water Yoga on August 1 was attended by 22 people. Additional classes will be offered August 8 and 15.
- Sent email blast with various GAFC news and events, as well as promoting the Greenbelt Youth Circus and Moonlit Movies.
- Working with Public Works on scheduling replacement of the lights in the indoor pool.
- Continued to evaluate and interview potential Lifeguards and Pool Managers.
- The Indoor Pool will be closed for annual cleaning starting Sunday, August 17 at 8pm and scheduled to re-open on Monday, August 25 at 6am. The Fitness Wing will be closed Monday, August 18 and Tuesday, August 19 for annual cleaning. Pass holders were notified by an e-mail blast; signs will also be posted at the facility.
- Staff worked the box office for the Greenbelt Youth Circus.

ARTS

- The Arts Program is supporting Creative Kids Camp by running a teen internship program creating props and costumes for the camp shows. Projects for session 4 have included a headdress and vintage microphone for Emperor Mang, space ranger boots for Spark Swenson, and art deco arm bands for the “Morethanyoo” camper group.
- Now on view at the Community Center Art Gallery: *Show Me a Story – Works from the Maryland Institute College of Art Illustration Department*. Featured artwork includes drawings, paintings and digital art created for children’s picture books, interactive children’s e-books, role playing games and animated film, as well as hand-made character plush toys and more. The show continues through August 15.
- Preparations are underway for the next exhibition at the Art Gallery, which will open August 25. The show will feature aerial photography of Maryland’s eastern shore by Peter Stern, along with cardboard sculptures of hives and rock formations by David Purcell.
- Ongoing activities include: the development of a group exhibition for Active Aging Week; preparations for the September 7 Artful Afternoon; processing of Festival of Lights Juried Art and Craft Fair applications; assisting CHEARS and alight dance theater with the Three Sisters Gardens RFQ for garden art/signage; preparation of a grant report for the Maryland State Arts Council.

COMMUNITY CENTER

- Greenbelt Youth Circus show is this weekend! For the bargain price of \$5, you will be entertained by 41 campers with acts ranging from unicycling to trapeze. Call 301-397-2208 for ticket availability.
- Creative Kids Camp presented two performances at the Arts Center of *Message To Tomorrow*, a new one-act musical by staffer Chris Cherry. The cast included 71 campers and camp staffers, along with Greenbelter Susan Smithers, who has generously volunteered her time this summer to play a savvy Greenbelt grandma who sends her materialistic grandkids on a Flash Gordon-style adventure to the moons of Jupiter. Models of the moons, along with several 1930’s-style sci-fi props, were created by participants in the stagecraft internship program.
- Camp letters were emailed for session 5.
- There were 4 facility permits processed.
- There were 2 private rentals and 8 pattern rentals.
- The following groups received free space: Golden Age Club, Greenbelt Writers Group, Greenbelt Concert Band, Greenbelt Labor Day Committee, Friends of the Greenbelt Museum, Greenbelt Nursery School, PG Peace & Justice Caucus and CHEARS.

THERAPEUTIC RECREATION

- The Fall Brochure final edits were done and the brochure is now online. It is hoped the printed version will be here at the beginning of next week. Resident registration begins on Monday.
- TR staff met with a parent and child on Wednesday to do a TR assessment. This child will be attending session 5 of Camp Pine Tree for the first time and an inclusion counselor will be assisting him.
- The TR Supervisor taught two Ageless Grace sessions with the Camp Pine Tree campers during their Kids Choice programs on Wednesday. The activities went well and the kids had a good time.
- TR staff had their weekly meeting on Thursday morning where staffing for the fifth session of camp was discussed.
- Twenty-five seniors travelled to Aldie, Virginia on Thursday for a British Tea at the British Pantry. Then the group went on a little driving adventure to Middleburg and the Aldie Historic Mill before returning to Greenbelt.
