City Manager's Report Week Ending September 20, 2019

- 1. Attached is the Police Department's Statistical Report for June 2019.
- 2. The City Council packet includes Pepco Vegetation Management Plan material. This includes a staff memo noting that both the Advisory Committee on Trees and the Forest Preserve Advisory Board approve the staff recommendation and issuance of a permit to Pepco. As the committees had not yet finalized written reports, the director has asked the chairpersons of both organizations to send Council written confirmation of the committees' approval of the City staff recommendation and issuance of a City permit.
- 3. Attached separately is material from the proposed Strong Towns event. Please note that while the City has not agreed to sponsor this event, the organizer is requesting sponsorship. As previously reported, in follow-up to Councilmember recommendation, the Multipurpose Room was reserved to help the organizer. It is not clear if the City of College Park has yet to approve a grant for a similar activity in College Park.
- 4. Upcoming movies in the park include: Greenbelt Station Central Park- September 28 and October 12, 2019 (Mary Poppins Returns and The Muppet Movie respectively) and Springhill Lake Recreation Center October 25, 2019 (Nightmare Before Christmas).
- 5. Thank you to Ms. Beverly Palau for taking initiative to address a community need in partnership with Verizon. Ms. Palau expressed appreciation that Verizon upgraded the City's modulator this week. The current modulator, equipment that transports content to the cable company, was out of date and not capable of supporting the upcoming closed captioning effort. Ms. Palau noted that Verizon responded within one day, inspected the site and within a few days a Verizon crew replaced the modulator. Ms. Palau shared that the replacement required challenging work and equipment to connect fiber from the street to the studio. According to Ms. Palau, 'Verizon went over and above in this situation. I was very pleased. We will now be able to caption on all of our municipal stations.'
- 6. The most recent payment to the Friends of the Old Greenbelt Theatre was about \$5,342. Mr. Sterling reported that the interior project continues to be delayed be a few weeks. A mid-November opening is anticipated.
- 7. Reviewing City Questionnaires, cell phone stipend program, and other operational items.




