CITY ELECTION IS NOVEMBER 5, 2019

DID YOU KNOW... the minimum voting age for the City Election has changed to 16 years old? The last day to register to vote in this election is Monday, October 7, 2019. All the information you need to register to vote is available at www.greenbeltmd.gov/elections.

ARE YOU THINKING OF RUNNING FOR CITY COUNCIL?

Any qualified voter who is at least 18 years of age may be nominated for the office of member of Council upon filing at the office of the City Clerk a nominating petition signed by not fewer than fifty (50) registered voters, a written acceptance of the nomination, and such other statements as may be required by charter or by

law. Upon the finding by the City Clerk that the nomination petition, the written acceptance, and such other statements as may be required are in order, the name of such nominee shall be authorized to be placed upon the ballot. Monday, August 19 is the first day to obtain papers and file a nomination petition. Monday, September 23 by 5:00 p.m. is the last day to file a nomination petition.

FISHING AT GREENBELT LAKE

Fishing at Greenbelt Lake is a fun activity for individuals and families, but there are a few rules and suggestions you should follow.

If you are 16 or older, you need to get a fishing license. You can get one online at https://compass.dnr. maryland.gov. The money you pay for your fishing license goes towards



conservation efforts and protects you from getting fined.

As you may know, Greenbelt Lake is mostly filled by storm water, so don't eat the fish! When you release the fish back into the lake, please don't throw it back in, as this would probably kill them. Gently release the hook and place the fish back in to the lake. You can see a demonstration on how to release a fish on the City's YouTube channel at https://youtu.be/YeybN0HWV1s.

Clean up all your fishing materials including lines, hooks, etc. These materials can be dangerous to other wildlife at the lake. "Leave no Trace" and let others enjoy the lake as you did.



AGING IN PLACE

The GAIL program, in partnership with Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland, will offer Aging in Place services for income qualified individuals in Greenbelt! This includes Habitat for Humanity's CAPABLE program which serves older adults who are experiencing challenges with activities of daily living by providing a more holistic approach to the idea of Aging In Place.

With the CAPABLE program, income qualified older adults have access to an Occupational Therapist and Registered Nurse, both of whom will conduct a series of visits in order to assist in the identification of challenges, setting of goals, and outlining of action plans for those goals. Within the parameters of the program, Habitat for Humanity is able to provide minor home modifications per the recommendation of the occupational therapist, which are geared toward improving independence.

NALOXONE (NARCAN)TRAINING AND AVAILABILITY

Naloxone is a life-saving medication that can quickly restore the breathing of a person experiencing an opioid overdose. Opioids are a group of drugs that include heroin and prescription medications like oxycodone, hydrocodone, morphine, fentanyl and methadone. Naloxone is available as a generic drug or under the brand names NARCAN® and EVZIO®

IT IS AVAILABLE FREE AND WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION! Call (301)583-5920 to register for free training and a free intranasal naloxone kit, which reverses an opioid overdose and helps prevent death. Now anyone can get naloxone at Maryland pharmacies without a prescription

CLOTHES DRYER SAFETY

Did you know?

You are at higher risk of having a clothes dryer fire if you don't clean your lint filter and dryer vents.



Follow these simple safety tips to prevent a clothes dryer fire in your home.

- Have your dryer installed and serviced by a professional.
- Do not use the dryer without a lint filter. Clean the lint filter before and after each cycle.
- Do not forget to clean the back of the dryer where lint can build up.
- Check the venting system behind the dryer to make sure that it is not damaged, crushed or restricted.
- Make sure that the outdoor vent covering opens when the dryer is operating

DON'T BE A SPEAR PHISHING VICTIM!

Spear phishing is the practice of using personal information to gain a person's confidence to make an attack more targeted. Phishing

scams work by tricking you into clicking on a link or attachment that either infects your machine with malware or takes you to a page that looks real but is designed to steal your private information.

You can protect yourself by creating strong, complex passwords. Passwords should be between 8 and 12 characters with a combination of upper and lowercase letters, numbers and symbols. Never use the same password for different accounts. Also, be careful what links you click on. Only click web links within e-mail you know to be authentic. If an organization, such as your bank, asks you to perform any activity that involves clicking links and entering credentials, either launch your browser and go directly to the bank's site or call them to double check on it. It's best to always assume the worst when it comes to following links. And lastly, be cautious when sharing data on social networks and limit what types of personal information you post on the internet. If there is anything that you do not want a potential scammer to see, do not post it you should also consider reviewing your privacy settings on social media sites.

Rain Check Rebate Program

The Rain Check Rebate Program provides eligible County residents and businesses the opportunity to receive a

reimbursement check for installing approved stormwater management practices that may help alleviate property flooding issues, lower water bills, and much more.

Stormwater runoff occurs when rain (or snowmelt) flows over the land picking up pollutants such as oil, grease, sediment, and nutrients that make their way into local streams and rivers.

This program is coordinated by the Chesapeake Bay Trust to offer incentives to homeowners, businesses, and others to install practices that will improve stormwater runoff quality, reduce runoff quantity, and improve local streams and rivers. Homeowners, businesses, and not-for-profit entities (including condominium and civic associations and churches) can recoup some of the costs of installing practices covered by the program. Up to \$4,000 is awarded for residential property owners and up to \$20,000 for commercial properties, multi-family dwellings, not-for-profit, and others.

CONTROLLING THE ASIAN TIGER MOSQUITOS

Spring is finally here! The combination of warmer and wetter weather also means mosquitos. Mosquitos aren't just a nuisance with their annoying buzzing and itchy bites, but they are also possible carriers of diseases such as West Nile virus and Zika.



The main culprit in urban and suburban areas such as Greenbelt is the Asian Tiger mosquito. These mosquitos have a flight range of only 100-200 yards and can breed in a body of water as small as a soda bottle lid. This makes them perfectly adapted to live in neighborhood yards where most other mosquito species cannot.

There are a few simple measures that you can take to rid their yards and neighborhoods of this pest.

The best way to keep the Asian Tiger mosquito at bay is to limit its breeding grounds. This means not having standing water in your yard. Reduce the number of items in you yard that can hold water, such as buckets, tarps, children's toys, plant pot trays, bird baths, wheelbarrows, etc. Dump the water daily from the ones that your do have.

An often over looked item is corrugated black piping that many people attach to their downspouts. The grooves in this piping hold water that can be used by the Asian Tiger mosquito to lay eggs. Place a fine screen over the opening of any corrugated black piping.
