CITY OF GREENBELT 2020 PROPOSED LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM SUMMARY

LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

■ OPPOSE BUREAU OF ENGRAVING & PRINTING FACILITY AT THE BELTSVILLE AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH CENTER

The Bureau of Printing and Engraving seeks to build a new facility located on a parcel at the BARC that would replace their facility in DC. The City opposes this proposal.

■ GREENBELT ROAD STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS

Fund the SHA Streetscape Improvement Program on Greenbelt Road (MD 193). An Urban Land Institute (ULI) Technical Assistance Panel (TAP) of regional experts met in June 2018 and issued a report. SHA summarized the status of the project in a June 2019 Report.

■ GREENBELT METRO STATION IMPROVEMENTS

- Improve station infrastructure
- Increase funding for pedestrian/bike trail connection to Greenbelt Station
- Upgrade to a full interchange

■ INCREASE M-NCPPC FUNDING FOR CITY RECREATION PROGRAMS

The City receives \$234,000 annually from M-NCPPC to help support City Recreation programs. This funding level has not increased since FY 2013. City taxpayers pay approximately \$1.7 Million in M-NCPPC Recreation Fund taxes.

■ BOND BILL FOR RECREATION AMENITIES AT GREENBELT STATION

Provide a State Bond Bill for recreational amenities at Greenbelt Station.

■ REPLACE SIDEWALKS ON STATE ROADS

Include funds in the State Budget for SHA to replace and maintain sidewalks along State roads.

■ BAN ON PLASTIC STRAWS

Prohibit plastic straws statewide due to their negative impact on the environment.

OPPOSE TRANSFER AND POTENTIAL PRIVATIZATION OF THE BALTIMORE/WASHINGTON PARKWAY

Governor Hogan has proposed transferring the B-W Parkway from the Federal Government to Maryland and widening it. The City opposes this effort.

OPPOSE BELTWAY WIDENING

This proposed public-private partnership would add managed toll lanes through some type of public-private arrangement. The City opposes this effort.

■ BLOCK THE MAGLEV TRAIN ROUTES THROUGH GREENBELT AND PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY

Both proposed alignments would run through Greenbelt. This project negatively impacts Greenbelt and the County with little benefit to our residents. The City opposes this effort.
