Yetta Lyle, Crisis Intervention Counselor, has participated in the following trainings:

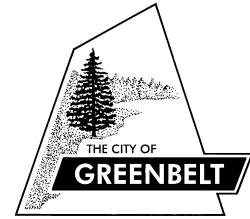
- Person Centered Therapy - The focus of the training was on the philosophy behind person centered planning, thinking and recovery. There was a discussion about traditional treatment planning vs person-centered planning.
- Client Patient Rights - An introduction to the rights guaranteed to clients of behavioral health providers. The webinar focused on rights guaranteed under Federal Law but state law.
- Crisis Management - The webinar provided training for licensed behavioral health professionals on how to recognize when a person is in crisis and how to return clients to a pre-crisis state.
- Ethical Decision Making - The training defined ethics and provided examples of what can be considered ethical situations.

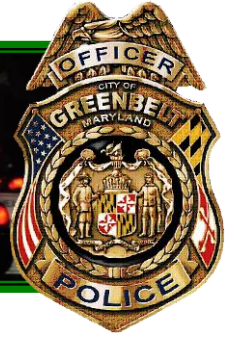

Other Items of Interest	Monitoring Prince George's County Emergency Operations Center website; and Continued working on user manual for Utopia software.



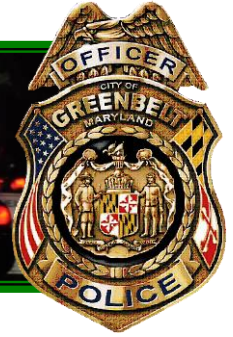
