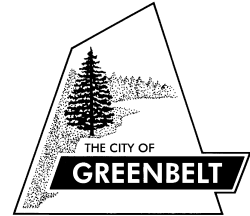
Museum Activities

- New Deal Map of DC: was asked to edit new map from the Living New Deal project at University of California, Berkely. Greenbelt is included as a site in the greater Washington area. Map will be launched in spring 2021.
- Online museum store: ongoing work to populate online gift shop with items for sale as part of Festival of Lights. The store is live, items will continue to be added.
- Holiday activities: researching and requesting images from current and former residents for slide show of vintage to contemporary photos of how Greenbelters celebrate the winter holidays. Slide show will be shown on Museum website as well as social media channels.
- FOGM Office Manager/Bookkeeper: ongoing training.
- Research: received inquiry about the location of the Cipriano Farm and about the Lenore Thomas Straus exhibit.
- Virtual lecture: attended "The Color of Law: A Forgotten History of How Our Government Segregated America," by Richard Rothstein who authored a book by the same name.
- Press: responded to questions during two interviews for separate Greenbelt News Review articles, one on Lenore Thomas Straus' bas reliefs on the Community Center building, the other on Museum holiday activities.
