- Preparations continued for an at-home DIY Wrapping Paper workshop (for any holiday or occasion).
 Supply kits will be made available for pick-up starting December 5, and an instructional video with Artist in Residence Keller will launch on YouTube on December 6. The workshop will introduce fun printmaking techniques for all ages, utilizing commonly available household items and materials. Fortynine participants are currently pre-registered.
