- Pulled together Black History month information for PIO staff.
- Attended senior staff meeting.
- Reviewed Greenbelt Senior Softball FY 2021 Operating Grant application.

- Staff are reviewing resources to prepare for an upcoming upgrade of RecTrac user interface.

YOUTH CENTER/ SPRINGHILL LAKE/PARK RANGERS/GREENBELT KIDS:
