- As more patrons flock to Buddy Attick Park, an increase in frequency of illegal parking, particularly on weekends and evening hours, has been noted.
- Provided the first day of programming for Greenbelt Recreation summer camps. Creative Kids Campers participated in a nature scavenger hunt led by Park Rangers. Programs will be provided throughout the summer for department camps at the Community Center, Youth Center, and Springhill Lake Recreation Center.
