### Week Ending October 8

Ricky Jackson attended a webinar on the Maryland Minor Consent for Mental Health Care Law Update. This law, which took effect October 1, allows minors as young as 12-years-old to seek mental and emotional healthcare without their parent's or guardian's consent. The law is intended to be used in special circumstances rather than on a regular basis. The law does now allow insurance companies to provide reimbursement for cases where a parent or guardian has not provided consent.

Sharon Johnson and Christal Batey began teaching a six-week virtual class – Powerful Tools for Caregiver. This best practice was deemed to meet the highest-level criteria for evidence-based disease prevention and health promotion by the Administration on Aging.

The GAIL Program, in partnership with the Prince George's County Health Department, will be offering a free flu shot clinic on Thursday, October 7, from 1 pm until 7 pm, at the Springhill Lake Community Center, and Tuesday, October 12, at the Greenbelt Community Center from 11 am until 5 pm.

Liz Park attended the Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) & Co-Occurring Substance Use Disorders (SUD) virtual training workshop offered by the University of Maryland School of Medicine.
