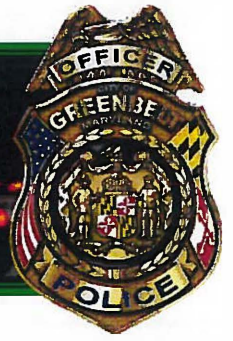

11/23/21 1245 hrs. 5900 block of Cherrywood Ter. Juvenile stated unknown individuals knocked on her door and when she looked out the peephole, she saw the individuals had a firearm. Officers responded to the area and did not locate anyone matching the description.

Victim stated someone called from the 'Baltimore Social Security Offices' and gave a fake name, ID number, and case number before stating that the victim owed money and needed to provide their full name and address. The victim complied, and then received a phone call from an individual claiming to be Detective Jack Williams ID #763159 from the Greenbelt Police Department and again stated the victim owed money and failure to pay would result in the freezing of his social security. The victim recognized the signs of a scam and did not provide the individual with any financial information. The Greenbelt Police Department will never ask for money from community members and there is no Detective Jack Williams employed here.

11/28/2021 On November 28, 2021 at approximately 1220 hrs, the Greenbelt Police Department received reports of a shooting in the 6100 block of Breezewood Court. When officers arrived, they located one adult male suffering from what appeared to be a gunshot wound. The victim was transported to a local hospital where he is in critical but stable condition. Later, at approximately 1302 hrs, an individual reported they were carjacked at gunpoint by three individuals in the 8300 block of Greenbelt Station Parkway. A white Toyota Prius (MD plate # 3DX4255) was taken. At this time, the Greenbelt Police Department believes



these two incidents are linked and the same suspects committed both crimes. The suspects are described as three black males wearing black hoodies, dark colored pants, and black masks. One suspect was described as heavy set, while the other two were described as tall and skinny. We are asking people in the area to check their security camera footage for any activity capturing the three males or the white Prius between the hours of 1200-1330. This investigation is ongoing, more information will be provided as it becomes available.
