Museum Activities

Programs:

- Black History Month program: Virtual tour of the Jim Crow Museum on February 22 is being advertised, 21 people have reserved. We do not have permission to record the program, but individuals can take a self-guided tour if we run out of space. Museum is also helping to promote Greenbelt Black History month.
- Valentine's Day open house at the Museum house has been scheduled for February 5, with an inclement weather date of February 12. Promotion of the event is ongoing. Attendees will have the opportunity to make a valentines cards for hospitalized children.


