Museum Weekly Report For Week Ending March 17, 2023

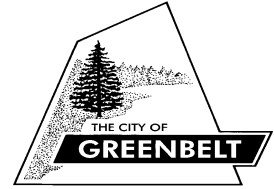
Museum Activities

- Programs:
 - Contacted two speakers for Asian American and Pacific Islander month in April.
 - Upcoming events: next Museum open house will be Sunday, April 2, 1-4pm. Submitted information to be included in the next activity guide for the open house and for Greenbelt Day Weekend.
 - Museum invited to work with Black History and Culture Committee on Juneteenth event.
- Reparations Commission: 2nd meeting took place on Tuesday, March 14. About half of the commission attended via Zoom. Owl Labs device worked well but other technical difficulties delayed the meeting. The group decided to meet on alternating third Tuesdays and Wednesdays to accommodate members' schedules. Staff working with schedulers in the Community Center to find space. Continuing to compile resources from members including articles, films, books etc related to reparations. Resources are being added to a Google Drive doc, though the commission may want to use Microsoft Teams in the future.
- 10A Project: Ongoing work on GHI permit request. Have received required permission for the addition from 3 neighbors. Staff have received complaints about the mold/mildew smell in 10A. Staff will consult with Public Works about potential testing.
- Walking Tours: Gave house tour to Public Information Office staff. Two recent groups canceled, one because not enough students could attend, the other due to budget issues around their transportation. We continue to receive inquiries about booked tours, however.
- 10B: Staff installed new spring exhibition featuring the Museum's Depression Glass collection.
- Education & Volunteers: Docent field trip to the Hirshhorn Museum is planned for 3/18.
- FOGM Board: First Board meeting with co-presidents took place Monday, March 13. Potential new Board member will be invited to attend the next meeting. FOGM is planning to rehire the office manager/bookkeeper position that they fund. Gift shop: Working with volunteer to develop new items for next fiscal year including an ornament, boxed notecards, and possibly architectural renderings.

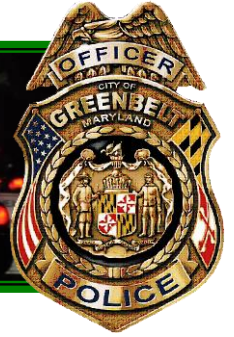
