Museum Weekly Report For Week Ending March 24, 2023

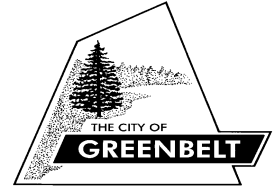
Museum Activities

- Programs:
 - Ongoing planning for lecture honoring Asian American and Pacific Islander month.
 - Upcoming events: next Museum open house will be Sunday, April 2, 1-4pm. Ongoing planning for Greenbelt Day Weekend and for Juneteenth event which Museum will work on with Black History and Culture Committee on Juneteenth event.
- Reparations Commission: Staff continuing to work with schedulers in the Community Center and the Youth Center to find space. Continuing to compile resources from members including articles, films, books etc related to reparations.
- 10A Project: On Sunday, March 19, staff along with Mayor Jordan and Mayor Pro Tem Kristin Weaver met with a group of elected officials from the Maryland state legislature who toured the 10A space and the house museum. The group included Delegates Nicole Williams and Ashanti Martinez from District 22 and Mark Chang from District 32 in Anne Arundel County, all of whom were highlighting and visiting four of the bond initiative request sites.
- Tugwell Room: Corresponded with PGCMLS staff regarding materials in the Tugwell Room. According to PGCMLS the only items that have been removed are books that needed cataloging and physical copies of the News Review which are obsolete. These were offered to the Museum in July 2022, but the Museum has a full set.
- 10B Museum house: Staff installed new spring exhibition featuring the Museum's Depression Glass collection and will add Easter and Passover items from the Museum collection in the next week.
- Next Community Center exhibition: Planning has begun for next Museum exhibition in the small first floor gallery has begun.
- Education & Volunteers: Docent field trip to the Hirshhorn Museum was canceled due to several attendees being sick. A returning Museum intern worked with staff on Wednesday, March 22.
- FOGM Board: Planning for rest of the calendar year ongoing. Reviewing job description and advertisement for the office manager/bookkeeper position.

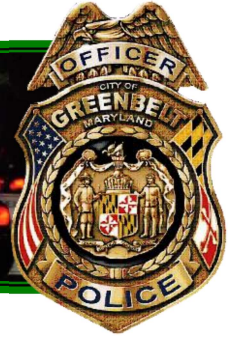
