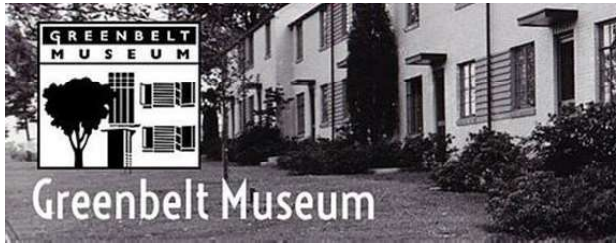

## Museum Activities

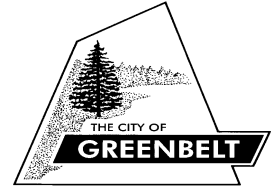
- Programs:
  - Promoting next Museum lecture about a Japanese Incarceration Camp during WWII via Eventbrite, social media, museum newsletter, website, News Review. The virtual talk will take place Tuesday, May 23, 7pm.
  - Next Museum open house will take place June 4, Greenbelt Day Weekend. Staff and volunteers will give short tours and there will be activities for kids in 10A including making small Greenbelt flags.
  - Other programs: Ongoing planning for Juneteenth event which Museum is cosponsoring with Black History and Culture Committee. Event will take place in the Community Center on June 13. Topic is the Sandy Spring Slave Museum.
- Reparations Commission: Meeting took place April 19 in the Youth Center multipurpose room. The group agreed they are not ready to speak with the press yet. Focus is still on self-organizing. Staff liaison will share publicly available information with Frederick, MD where they are holding public forums on the topic in response to request.
- 10A Project: Received word from the Maryland State General Assembly that Greenbelt will be awarded \$100,000 in bond funds for the 10A project. Permit package will be submitted to GHI next week.
- Council Budget Work Session: Director attended work session on Recreation Department and the Museum. Museum organizational move to the Rec Department will be complete after Council approves proposed FY 2024 budget.
- Tours: Director gave private tour to scholar from Georgetown University and a gentleman researching housing cooperatives on April 17. Walking tour map: Received quote for map reprint. Reprint should be completed by end of fiscal year.
- Outreach to University of MD: Director, as a member of the Museum Studies Certificate Program steering committee, attended quarterly meeting. Museum staff did a virtual class visit and discussion with students in the certificate program.
- Education/Volunteers: Planning meeting with Education/Volunteer Coordinator to discuss volunteer recruitment and training, upcoming programs, and other possible initiatives.

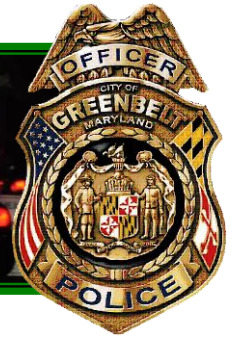
