# **Greenbelt CARES**



Week Ending May 19

Liz Park spoke to graduate students in the University of Maryland's Couple and Family Therapy program about internships and employment opportunities at Greenbelt CARES.

Green Ridge House hosted a "Snack and Chat with the State's Attorney" event on May 9. State's Attorney Aisha Braveboy spoke about preventing financial fraud for seniors. Twenty residents, as well as district delegates and members of the Greenbelt police, were in attendance. Lunch was served.

The GAIL program kicked off a summer rotation of the Community Nursing program by way of a new partnership with Chamberlain University School of Nursing. The student nurses will provide services to residents of Green Ridge House during this first summer session and run through June 27, 2023.

CARES hosted a Job Fair on Saturday, May 6, at Beltway Plaza Mall. Thirteen businesses attended and spoke to and over 100 potential employees. Participants ranged in age from 16 to 62 and came from many communities such as Greenbelt, Hyattsville, College Park, Lanham and Upper Marlboro.

Teresa Smithson attended the UMD and UMBC Schools of Social Work Field Instructors Appreciation Webinar: A SHARP Approach to Building the Therapeutic Alliance, on Tuesday. The webinar covered the five components in the SHARP framework which are: 1) Structural oppression; 2) Historical context; 3) Analysis of role; 4) Reciprocity and mutuality; and 5) Power. It discussed how to apply this via Narrative Therapy, with clients and in supervising graduate interns.

The GAIL Program has begun to offer Aging Solo - a 6-week virtual class. Aging Solo is a national award-winning online learning opportunity designed to help participants take charge of their aging. Topics addressed include: Your social network and support network, healthcare decisions-making end of life choices, aging in place, making a move and your next steps. Due to popular demand, a second class has been booked for September 2023. By word of mouth this class is half full already.
