

# Greenbelt is Selected for the FBI Headquarters!









On November 8, the General Services Administration (GSA) announced they had officially selected the City of Greenbelt as the new home for the FBI Headquarters. Governor Wes Moore and federal, county, and state officials held a press conference in Greenbelt on November 10 to celebrate this milestone.

"Working alongside the FBI, Governor Wes Moore, and Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks, we will drive transformative community development for our region, catalyzing economic growth, opportunities, and social well-being for all our residents," said Mayor Emmett Jordan. "This collaborative effort underscores our shared commitment to the FBI's essential mission of protecting our nation."

The FBI building will be built near the Greenbelt Metro and is expected to take a few years to complete. The new FBI headquarters is projected to bring thousands of jobs to the area during construction and as part of the FBI's ongoing operations. The development of this state-of-the-art complex, encompassing a vast area of 61 acres, is expected to represent a multi-billion-dollar investment in the region.



Bring Your Own Bag Bill Effective January 1, 2024

# BRING YOUR OWN BAG

Single-use plastic bags at the point of sale NO LONGER ALLOWED

Beginning January 1, 2024, the City of Greenbelt's Bring Your Own Bag ordinance and Prince George's County's similar Better Bag Bill aims to reduce single-use plastic bag use and litter in our local waterways.

What does this mean? Greenbelt retail establishments will be prohibited from providing plastic carryout bags to shoppers. If a customer requests a paper bag or reusable bag at the point of sale, the customer must pay at least 10 cents for each bag, with certain exceptions.

Who is affected? All retail stores, restaurants, grocery stores, or any other establishment that provides single-use plastic bags to its customers due to the sale of a product or service, whether for-profit or not-for-profit.
